

# Conroe Community Cemetery Sign Installation takes place

The installation of a sign at the entrance to the Conroe Community Cemetery was a landmark day in the history of the cemetery.

The installation happened on May 6 at the Cemetery, located on North Tenth Street in Conroe.

"The cemetery now has its name prominently displayed 128 years after the first known burial of a 9 month old child, whose last name was Armstrong," said Conroe Community Cemetery Restoration Project Treasurer John Meredith. It has been variously known as the No-Name Cemetery, Conroe Cemetery and Community Cemetery in the past. "It wasn't until Jon Edens, President of the Conroe Community Cemetery Restoration Project, filed a Notice of Cemetery with

the State of Texas on October 30, 2014 that it officially became the Conroe Community Cemetery.”
